The day began with the Headteacher's assembly in the hall with all the staff and children. Mr Richard Sheriff, CEO of the Trust, was also invited to the assembly to give out long service awards to the staff. It was a wonderful celebration of all the dedicated staff at Austhorpe. What a lot of awards! Unbelievably there were even a couple of 20-year service awards. There was also a celebration of the children who received Headteacher awards and prizes for various school initiatives. The assembly ended with the introduction of 'Go-Kart Week' by Mrs Haigh. The children sat quietly and attentively through the whole assembly which lasted about an hour.

I then joined Year 5 in their classroom where they began the preliminary work for Go-Kart week. They were working hard on creating a setting for their Go-Kart week. Using the iPads (very efficiently) they drew a scene which they then had to describe to their partner. This then led into some writing. The class were very calm and focused on their learning. They very worked well in pairs, including moving sensibly around the classroom.

After breaktime I returned to Year 5 for Maths. They were designing their Go-Kart track and adding measurements. They had to convert their measurements from metres to kilometres. All the children chose a challenge level appropriate to them. Yet again, the class were so engaged and enthusiastic.

It was a pleasure to see Year 5 again and see how they have matured over the year. They were all very happy and settled in the class. Miss Pickles had some very creative ideas to link the 'Go Kart week' to their topics in class. The children were so excited about Go-kart jousting!

In the afternoon we came back together as Governors to discuss the data with Miss Lightfoot and Mr Morley. The data was coming in very rapidly and we were presented with 'hot off-the-press' data! It all looked very promising, with the school data consistently above both Leeds and National data. It was also clear how hard the staff and pupils have worked post-pandemic to return the children's levels to pre-covid levels. There is still more work to be done, particularly in writing across school, but the trend was clearly moving in the right direction.
